




### **State General Funding Per Student since 2008**









State General Funding Per Student since 2008 Arid Desert







#### The Nationwide Drought State General Funding Per Student since 2008



Does moving in the right direction during this drought mean we're complying with Washington children's constitutional right to an amply funded K-12 education?



First: Doing better than <u>another</u> State isn't compliance with the constitutional rights of kids in <u>our</u> State.

As the court bluntly put it when the State of Kansas argued its school funding system is better than many others:

"This argument seems to the Court to be on a par with the following statement:

'Persons of color should be comforted by the fact that lynchings in Kansas are no more frequent than lynchings in many other states."

Montoy v. State of Kansas, 2003 WL 22902963 at \*43, ¶59.


Second: Our State's recent funding increases still leave us far BEHIND other States since we started in the national cellar.


As our State's Board of Education Chair put it at trial:

Washington state is in the cellar of national education statistics. We are 44th in total expenditures per student, ... and the list goes on. We are veritable front-runners in the race to the bottom. It's time we climb out of the cellar.




Have We Climbed out of the Cellar?







Technical Working Group then determined increases needed to cover the market rate salary component are over \$2.991 billion/year (about \$2,991/pupil for 1 million students). \$9,710 + \$2,991 = \$12,701.

### EDUCATION IS A CIVIL RIGHT

"Education ... plays a critical civil rights role in promoting equality in our democracy."

"... amply provided, free public education operates as the great equalizer in our democracy, equipping citizens born into underprivileged segments of our society with the tools they need to compete on a level playing field with citizens born into wealth or privilege."

"Education ... is the number one civil right of the 21st century."







compliance by the deadline.


# PHASE-IN PLAN

# "There must in fact be a plan."

It must be a <u>complete</u> plan for <u>fully</u> implementing the State's program of basic education for each school year to the 2017-2018 school year, addressing each of the areas of K-12 education within ESHB 2261 and SHB 2776.


It must include a phase-in schedule for fully funding each of the components of basic education.


