

About SIRS

SIRS began in the early sixties through the collaborative efforts of WASA, WSSDA, AWSP, and the ESDs.

In 1975, the legislature recognized the need for a service that would provide current research and data relating to administrative responsibilities in the public schools by authorizing school districts to pay for such services. RCW 28A.320.110 authorizes school districts to “become members of a non-profit organization whose principal purpose is to provide information on school organization, administration, operation, finance, and instruction.”

SIRS members include Washington State public school districts, educational service districts, and public educational management/leadership associations serving on the SIRS Board of Directors. Currently, there are over 200 SIRS members. The annual fee for school district membership is based on district size. Strategic planning and the increased use of technology have resulted in program efficiencies, allowing SIRS to keep fees low.

Research Services

SIRS Salary Survey Reports

SIRS annually compiles and publishes a timely salary-and-benefits report of Washington's school employees in three parts: 1) administrators, 2) classified personnel, and 3) teachers. SIRS is introducing, new in 2019–20, an additional longitudinal report presenting the past 10-years Washington State school employee salary information. The quality of data, through the self-reporting SIRS survey, will help facilitate valuable trend analysis for any district. The longitudinal tool is presented in an easy to use Microsoft Excel workbook and utilizes pivot charts and slicing tools to better visualize trends and comparisons amongst pertinent comparable districts.

Only SIRS members can access the full online surveys. The Excel spreadsheets, allowing members to create specialized reports by grouping information for any position from any size district.

Legislative Handbook

The SIRS Legislative Handbook is an annual guide to the Washington State Legislature. It provides school administrators and professional associations with information about our state government including directories (with pictures of our legislators and congressional delegation), direct links to websites and email addresses, legislative district maps, committee membership, caucus leadership, legislative staff, advocacy tips, sample letter/email, an explanation of how a bill becomes a law, and much more. The handbook is available to SIRS members and can be downloaded and distributed to your staff.
