Last week, you received a communication which announced the opening of WASA's Honorary Awards nominations for 2021–22. **The Honorary Awards Committee** has made some changes that I want to reinforce and amplify.

Three of the awards now have a clearer and prominent recognition of leadership for equity, embedded in the awards criteria. The **Award of Merit** and **Student Achievement Leadership Award** acknowledge and highlight work that champions access, equity, and social justice for the improvement of student achievement. Last year, the committee created a new award, the **WASA Student Leadership Award**, which recognizes outstanding student leaders who have created or played a significant leadership role in initiatives that promote access, equity, or social justice in their school and community.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The 2022 Legislative Session is in its final days and is set to adjourn on Thursday, March 10. The Legislature has entered its budget phase and Senate and House budget-writers are in process of negotiating Supplemental Operating, Capital, and Transportation Budgets. Budget-writers have a substantial budget surplus to use as they craft a final compromise Operating Budget; both Senate and House proposals increase the underlying 2021–23

Operating Budget by over \$6.0 billion. Both legislative proposals provide funding for WASA's major priorities (enhanced staffing allocations; enrollment stabilization; and pupil transportation); however, even with proposed substantial increases, both budgets would result in a net reduction in K–12 education funding, due to a nearly \$1.0 billion Maintenance Level reduction.

Continue to follow *TWIO* and WASA's Legislative Podcast for up-to-date information. Following the session's adjournment, be sure to review WASA's End of Session Summary to analyze the full details of the adopted 2022 Supplemental Operating and Capital Budgets. The Summary will also contain a comprehensive review of the many education-related bills the Legislature addressed this session. It will be e-mailed to all TWIO subscribers—and available on the WASA website)—as soon as it is completed.


